

**RESOLUTION NO. 886 -2017, DECLARING NOVEMBER AS  
“MILITARY CAREER MONTH” IN SUFFOLK COUNTY**

**WHEREAS**, the freedom, peace and security that United States citizens enjoy are the direct result of the sacrifices made by members of the nation’s Armed Forces; and

**WHEREAS**, the United States military offers young people education and career opportunities in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (“STEM”) and other career fields, coupled with world class technical training; military service also instills the pride, work ethic and discipline needed to succeed in today’s economy; and

**WHEREAS**, these career opportunities begin as early as high school, with the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery, which measures student propensity in career fields and “March 2 Success”, which provides free standardized test preparation to aid student performance on the SAT and ACT exams; and

**WHEREAS**, members of the United States military are respected and recognized for their dedication and contribution to our nation’s welfare and their teamwork in the defense of civil liberties; and

**WHEREAS**, Suffolk County should encourage students and parents to learn more about military careers, the opportunities the military provides educationally and professionally and the benefits of engaging in military service; and

**WHEREAS**, in furtherance of that goal, November should be recognized as “Military Career Month” in the County of Suffolk; now, therefore be it

**1st RESOLVED**, that beginning in 2017 and continuing each year thereafter, November shall be designated as “Military Career Month” in the County of Suffolk in order to raise awareness of the multitude of educational and career options available to individuals who serve in the United States Armed Forces; and be it further

**2nd RESOLVED**, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20), (21) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
