**RESOLUTION NO. 131 -2018, AMEND RESOLUTION NO.
1017-2016, THE SUFFOLK COUNTY PUBLIC
TRANSPORTATION WORKING GROUP**

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 1017-2016 established the Suffolk County Public Transportation Working Group to enhance the provision of public transportation services to meet the needs of the public; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of Resolution No. 1017-2016 the Working Group is charged with issuing a report within one year of the resolution's effective date at which time the Working Group would dissolve; and

WHEREAS, the Working Group has proven to be an effective instrument of public policy by bringing together interested stakeholders, advocating for additional resources and identifying needed improvements to the public transportation system in Suffolk County; and

WHEREAS, the Public Transportation Working Group should remain intact at least through November of 2019 as much work needs to be done to improve public transportation in Suffolk County and in the Long Island region; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that the 8th RESOLVED clause of Resolution No. 1017-2016 is hereby amended as follows:

8th RESOLVED, that the Working Group will issue [a] reports [of its findings and recommendations] to the County Executive and each member of the County Legislature [within one year of the effective date of this resolution] on public transportation issues when the Working Group deems it necessary and appropriate to further its mission; and be it further

2nd RESOLVED, that the 9th RESOLVED clause of Resolution No. 1017-2016 is hereby amended as follows:

9th RESOLVED, that the Working Group will terminate [upon the release of its report] on November 30, 2019, unless it is reauthorized by a new resolution of the County of Suffolk; and be it further

3rd RESOLVED, that all other terms and conditions of Resolution No. 1017-2016 shall remain in full force and effect; and be it further

4th RESOLVED, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20), (21) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations,

rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
