**RESOLUTION NO. 144 -2018, HONORING ANTHONY (TONY)
BOCCHIMUZZO BY RENAMING THE 9-1-1 CALL CENTER IN
YAPHANK**

WHEREAS, Anthony (Tony) Bocchimuzzo was the Suffolk County Police Department's civilian supervisor of 911 dispatchers; and

WHEREAS, the County of Suffolk wishes to recognize Anthony (Tony) Bocchimuzzo's 26 years of outstanding service to the County and its residents; and

WHEREAS, Tony Bocchimuzzo led training and compiled data for the ShotSpotter program, and also served as communications coordinator in those situations where Suffolk police interacted with State and federal agencies; and

WHEREAS, in addition to his work in the Police Department, Mr. Bocchimuzzo was a volunteer firefighter in Coram for 31 years, where he served as a lieutenant; and

WHEREAS, Tony Bocchimuzzo worked as a dispatcher for the Coram and Setauket Fire Department before starting work as a civilian police dispatcher at the age of 23; he rose through the ranks to become a supervisor of dispatchers; and

WHEREAS, tragically, in July of 2017, Tony Bocchimuzzo passed away at the age of 49; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 215 of the NEW YORK COUNTY LAW and Chapter 1016 of the SUFFOLK COUNTY CODE, the 9-1-1 Call Center in Yaphank, shall be named "The Anthony Bocchimuzzo Call Center"; and be it further

2nd RESOLVED, that the Suffolk County Department of Public Works is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to take all actions necessary and appropriate to effectuate this naming and dedication; and be it further

3rd RESOLVED, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20), (21) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
