RESOLUTION NO. -2019, AUTHORIZING A CUSTODIAL LICENSE AGREEMENT WITH FARMINGVILLE HISTORICAL SOCIETY FOR THE "FARMINGVILLE HISTORIC DISTRICT" PROPERTY

WHEREAS, Farmingville Historical Society is a not-for-profit organization, that has been authorized by the Suffolk County Historic Trust to act as a custodian of the "Farmingville Historic District", which includes the Bald Hill Schoolhouse and the Elijah Terry House and has operated under a custodial license agreement with the County dated January 30, 2009 to assist in the restoration, maintenance and management of the property known as the "Farmingville Historic District"; and

**WHEREAS**, Farmingville Historical Society has expressed a willingness to continue to assist the County in restoring, maintaining and managing of the "Farmingville Historic District", and providing public tours with its own staff and volunteers for the public at the "Farmingville Historic District"; and

**WHEREAS**, Farmingville Historical Society will act as custodian pursuant to the Historic Trust Manual, Revised Edition, 2010, as published by the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality; and

**WHEREAS**, Farmingville Historical Society would like to enter into a license agreement for a term of twenty (20) years with the County of Suffolk for the non-exclusive use, restoration, maintenance and management of the "Farmingville Historic District" including the Bald Hill School House, and Elijah Terry House, and the surrounding grounds, structures and buildings at the "Farmingville Historic District"; now, therefore be it

- **RESOLVED**, that the Suffolk County Department of Parks, Recreation, Conservation is hereby authorized, empowered, and directed, pursuant to Section 28-4(D) of the SUFFOLK COUNTY CHARTER, to enter into a License Agreement, for a term of twenty (20) years with Farmingville Historical Society, for the non-exclusive use, restoration, maintenance and management of the "Farmingville Historic District"; and be it further
- **RESOLVED**, that this Legislature, being the lead agency under the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), N.Y. Environmental Conservation Law Article 8 and Chapter 450 of the Suffolk County Code, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(26) and (33) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS ("NYCRR") in that the action constitutes routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment. The Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
