RESOLUTION NO. 236 -2019, ACCEPTING AND APPROPRIATING A DONATION OF \$7,500 FROM SHERRY WHEATON, A PRIVATE CITIZEN, TO THE SUFFOLK COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR THE SPECIFIC PURCHASE OF A CANINE FOR THE SUFFOLK COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT CANINE SECTION IN MEMORY OF HER HUSBAND, SCOTT J. WHEATON, A PRIVATE CITIZEN

WHEREAS, Sherry Wheaton has made a donation of \$7,500 to the Suffolk County Police Department for the purchase of a canine for the Suffolk County Police Department's Canine Section; and

WHEREAS, said donation of \$7,500 has not been included in the 2019 Suffolk County Operating Budget; and

WHEREAS, the Police Commissioner finds that this donation will enable the Police Department to purchase a law enforcement trained canine which is an important asset in the fight against crime; now, therefore be it
