THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER AT 2:03 PM

CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:

All Legislators report to the horseshoe, please. All rise for the Pledge of Allegiance led by Legislator Donnelly.

SALUTATION

Welcome to the regular Committee meeting of Public Works, Transportation and Energy. In the beginning we have public portion. I have one card. If anyone else would like to address the Committee, please fill out a card with the Clerk. You have three minutes. George Hoffman.

PUBLIC PORTION

MR. HOFFMAN:

Good afternoon. For the record my name is George Hoffman. And I'm here on behalf of the Fire Island Association. And I just -- I'm here because of the resolutions having to do with the ferry company rate increases.

Just wanted to remind you that there's been an informal process after the last couple of years where this Legislature helps us convene a meeting with the ferry company owner and some of the impacted communities to discuss the rate hike, to get a better understanding of the operating environment that the ferry company is facing; and also sometimes to talk about service issues.

So that's been very helpful to us. I think it's bought a lot of support for some of the increases that have been adopted. We haven't seen the Budget Review Report yet of the -- you know, what's behind the operating environment that they're involved in, but, you know, it seems to be pretty modest. But we would always be interested in learning, you know, what challenges the ferry company is facing.

Now I think this is coming up for a public hearing at the next meeting. I think that's Tuesday. We would ask that if you could keep it open or recess it so that if there is anything that comes out in the Budget Review Report, we could, you know, bring that to your attention. And hopefully we'll -- I think Legislator Lindsay is working on a meeting with the community leaders and the ferry company sometime in the next week or two. So just wanted to bring it to your attention.

CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:

Thank you. That's very reasonable to keep it open so everyone has a chance to comment also at the following meeting in Hauppauge. Legislator Flotteron is interested in meeting with the community also.

MR. HOFFMAN:

Yes.

1 **CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:**

2 Does that affect -- would you have more than one meeting? How many
3 communities are affected by the ferry service there? I'm not that
4 familiar with it. That's why I'm asking.

5
6 **MR. HOFFMAN:**

7 I think like there's six -- I think there's six communities. We'd
8 like to do -- one meeting should suffice. That's how we've done it
9 in the past where we've had, you know, one or two Legislators that
10 are actually representing those communities. And they've been very
11 productive.

12
13 **CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:**

14 Great. Legislator Flotteron.

15
16 **LEG. FLOTTERON:**

17 Again, mostly myself focusing in my Legislative District which is
18 probably more like a dozen communities. But you said also it's the
19 -- there's a resolution for Davis Park and everything out by you
20 also in Patchogue.

21
22 **MR. HOFFMAN:**

23 Not this time; no, not this one. This one is just Fire Island
24 ferries but it does take in both towns Brookhaven, I think, is
25 Ocean Bay Park. And then there's Seaview, which is also
26 Brookhaven.

27
28 **LEG. FLOTTERON:**

29 Yeah.

30
31 **MR. HOFFMAN:**

32 And then the rest of the communities are probably in your district.

33
34 **LEG. FLOTTERON:**

35 Yeah. There's at least a dozen communities from Kismet, Saltaire,
36 Lonelyville, Ocean Bay, Ocean Bay Park, Point O' Woods. That's the
37 only name -- some of them, so.

38
39 **MR. HOFFMAN:**

40 Okay.

41
42 **LEG. FLOTTERON:**

43 And, again, yes, I would request we do keep -- when we have the
44 public hearing, we do keep it open. Because there are some year
45 rounders there who don't even have car permits for Fire Island.
46 And there's very limited service, especially to get off the Island
47 to make it out here in Riverhead, is not -- it's very inconvenient.
48 So hopefully give them two opportunities minimum.

49
50 **CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:**

51 It sounds very reasonable. All right. Thank you.
