THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER AT 2:02 PM

CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:

All rise for the Pledge of Allegiance led by Legislator Donnelly.

SALUTATION

PUBLIC PORTION

Welcome to the regular committee meeting of Public Works, Transportation and Energy. At the beginning we have public portion. We have -- we have one card, Paul Pressman. Welcome, Paul. Oh, I didn't see you there.

MR. PRESSMAN:

Good afternoon, Legislators.

LEG. FLEMING:

Good afternoon.

MR. PRESSMAN:

I'm not in a very good mood today and it's not taking it out on you. It's just -- let me just say the good things first. I had a very nice conversation with DPW and I do appreciate you guys passing the resolution for the money for new buses. I want to let you know that there are no problems with the new buses they are going to purchase. There are no Arboc buses. They are -- the new 35, 40-foot buses that we have on the road now that are ADA-compatible, the new SCAT buses, which are sorely needed because SCAT ridership keeps going up. And, unfortunately, if the line buses ran the way the SCAT buses ran, I wouldn't be here every single time talking about the same things.

I'm just really, really annoyed and really pissed off, excuse my French, because I have spent the last three months with every freaking Suffolk County Legislator in this state who just looked me in the face and told me that they were working bipartisanly; and yet when it came to the budget, in each house's budget to go before the Governor, not one freaking penny was in there for transportation anywhere. And that's thanks to ex-Legislators Martinez, Stern; all of these that said they were working together, that took bus rides with me and know what all the problems are. And not one stinking dime.

So let me ask you a simple question: You approved everything. They're going to have an outside source come in here and tell you how they're going to fix bus schedules and everything. What can they fix? The buses will run the same way. Maybe they'll have a couple new routes, but how is it going to change anything? There isn't a dime. DPW has done every stinking thing they can to get funding. Unfortunately all federal funding is for capital improvement. The only way we get any operational improvement is from the state. And obviously Mr. Cuomo doesn't know a thing about a subway; doesn't know a thing about the LIRR; and doesn't know a thing about a bus. And that's just absolutely wrong. I'm sorry. And I understand -- you know, and this really annoys me

1 because I was in prison at one time. You know what? Not for
2 nothing, I don't care about prison reform because what's the
3 difference whether somebody gets bail or not if they killed
4 somebody. But meanwhile the seniors, the people that are disabled,
5 people that don't -- can't afford cars -- you have all this
6 affordable housing and people can't -- they can't even afford that,
7 how are they going to afford a car and then they can't even get
8 anywhere because we can't have bus service because we can't get a
9 lousy \$20 million to run the buses to eleven o'clock at night.
02:05PM 10 Everything else can get fixed, but if you don't have the money to
11 do that, what is it worth? I mean, there's really nothing else to
12 say. I mean, I'm ready to go up to Albany and basically shoot
13 them. They actually -- I'm sorry, I apologize.

15 **LEG. BERLAND:**

16 Say you're joking.

17
18 **CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:**

19 Yeah, we don't want to get too worked up, Paul.

20
21 **MR. PRESSMAN:**

22 All right, I was joking about that.

23
24 **CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:**

25 We understand.

26
27 **MR. PRESSMAN:**

28 But to be honest with you, they work slower than our buses run.
29 And it's absolutely ridiculous at this point. I don't like being
02:06PM 30 looked in the face and told they're doing this, this and this and
31 not one thing gets done. And I know that people here have done
32 everything they can do. I know they've been after DPW. Okay? I
33 know Bridget's been to Albany. I know other people have been to
34 Albany. Wait 'til the -- wait 'til we have the other meeting
35 because I want the bus companies to get involved because it affects
36 them as much as it affects anybody else. Because if we don't get
37 better bus service, we don't get ridership; the bus companies don't
38 make money and things don't work right. And the people that work
39 for the bus companies are taxpayers here as well.

40
41 Thank you. I'm sorry I took over the time and I apologize for some
42 of my words.

43
44 **CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:**

45 Thank you for your interest there, Paul. We understand that you're
46 frustrated.

47

36 question about whether they were going to make it easier for the
37 employees to ride the ferry and not cost the employees so much.

02:09PM 40 I do not know. I didn't see anything. So I don't know if there's
41 anyone from DPW who can answer that -- if they know. That would be

17 Legislator Berland.

19 **LEG. BERLAND:**

02:09PM 20 Yes, do we know if they answered Legislator Gonzalez's question on
21 whether they were going to try to help the employees on Fire
22 Island; have they discounted the rate?

23

24 **CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:**

25 That's a good question. Maybe someone here from the Administration
26 or from DPW can answer that. I'd like to ask the gentleman from
27 the ferries also. But I'd like to hear from everybody. Everyone's
28 welcome.

29

30 **MS. FLESHER:**

31 State your name, please.

32

33 **MR. KAUFMAN:**

34 Good afternoon. I'm Luke Kaufman. I'm operations manager for Fire
35 Island Ferries.

36

37 **CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:**

38 Welcome.

39

40 **MR. KAUFMAN:**

41 Internally we've had many conversations since we met here on the
42 26th. We did talk about the reduced rate ticket and we're still in
43 discussion over that right now. I can't answer your question
44 whether Tim Mooney got in touch with anybody with you. He's away
45 right now but internally we have been discussing it.

46

47 **CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:**

48 So and it's based on the amount of tickets sold -- who you would
49 judge would be eligible for that category of discount and then how
02:11PM 50 many you'd sell and then how you'd make up that --

51

52 **MR. KAUFMAN:**

53 Well, again, it goes to what those discounted books were originally
54 meant to do. And as Tim pointed out, those books were originally
55 brought into the picture to get people out of their trucks and on
56 the boat. And we never, ever were considering extending into the

1 summer season. But once Hurricane Sandy hit, it was the right
2 thing to do. But come 2015 there were such abuses and who was
3 using that ticket, we decided to go back and just have it for the
4 ten months of the off-season.

5
6 **CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:**

7 Okay, so it's available for ten months.

8
9 **MR. KAUFMAN:**

10 Yes.

11
12 **LEG. BERLAND:**

13 But I think the specific question was, you know, the young kids
14 were going out there and working for the summer who are, you know,
15 making minimum wage and not making a lot of money but have to pay a
16 lot of money to actually get back and forth, you know, to and from
17 work, that there should be some discounts.

18
19 **MR. KAUFMAN:**

20 Understood. And we have been discussing that. I don't have an
21 answer for you for that today, but we have been discussing that.

22
23 **LEG. BERLAND:**

24 All right. So, question for Counsel, has does that -- if we table
25 the rates, can you agree to give them the license and table the
26 rates until they have an answer for that?

27
28 **MS. SIMPSON:**

29 We can.

30
31 **LEG. BERLAND:**

32 Oh, good. So I'd like to make a motion to table the rates until we
33 have an answer for that.

34
35 **CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:**

36 So we have a motion to table. Is there a second?

37
38 **LEG. MURATORE:**

39 I'll second.

40
41 **CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:**

42 Second by Legislator Muratore. On that motion, I mean is it -- how
43 critical is it to approve -- what's the timeline here on approving
44 these?

45
46 **MR. KAUFMAN:**

47 I mean, they do get discounted rates as it is. You can buy reduced
48 rate books.

49
50 **LEG. BERLAND:**

51 Based on my recollection of the testimony that there was not a
52 reduced rate for --

53
54 **MR. KAUFMAN:**

55 A really reduced rate for the contractors for the wintertime to get
56 them off the -- out of their trucks and on the boat. But we --

1 let's say 2012, we offered that for two seasons after that. And it
2 was because there was such unbelievable construction going on on
3 Fire Island to get the place rebuilt. But the intention never was
4 to have that ticket be for checkout girls and waiters and
5 bartenders.

6
7 **LEG. BERLAND:**

8 But I think that was the question Legislator Gonzalez asked. And I
9 think it's a really valid point. Because if, you know, you're
10 paying people minimum wage and you're charging them, they have to
11 -- this is the only way in or out. So this is the way they have to
12 go. And if they're paying more than half of their salaries in some
13 instances to, you know, ride back and forth, I think, that there
14 should be, you know, some discounted thing for the servers.

15
16 **MR. KAUFMAN:**

17 There is. You can buy a 40-trip book now, which I believe is 40
18 percent off the full fair roundtrip ticket that you buy.

19
20 **LEG. BERLAND:**

21 But that's more than the cost of the ten-month.

22
23 **MR. KAUFMAN:**

24 Yeah, I believe it's a dollar.

25
26 **LEG. BERLAND:**

27 Well, every dollar adds up when you're making minimum wage and
28 you're paying all this money, so. That was my question. Is this
29 going to affect -- I mean I don't want to affect, you know, them
30 being able to run the ferries and do what they do, but I would
31 also, you know, like to help all the young kids who are summer
32 employees there and see if maybe they can get the same rate as, you
33 know, the people who get the discount rate for the ten month.

34
35 **CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:**

36 I don't know. It's hard to figure where the money's going to come
37 from. I mean, it's hard to get to the Island and it costs more
38 like -- like anyone on Long Island it costs more to do business
39 because you have to go over the -- over the bridge to get here. So
40 it's just a function of where the Island is. You have to get
41 there, so. Legislator Cilmi has a --

42
43 **LEG. CILMI:**

44 Well, I was just going to say, first of all, the timeliness of this
45 is certainly important. They have to get things printed up. And,
46 you know, the number of workers that work over there is obviously
47 limited compared to the number of people who utilize the ferry
48 service. So approving the rate increase now is important. And we
49 have two things from the ferry that sort of serve to support that
50 because in the one case, those workers can already buy a heavily
51 discounted 40-trip book. And if they're working over there,
52 chances are they're going to use those forty trips.

53
54 And, secondly, the Ferry is contending with increases in minimum
55 wage that have been imposed upon them. So they're paying their
56 employees more. It costs them more. So there's only so much that

1 you can, you know, continue to dig down. If they have available --
2 if the workers have available to them currently the discounted
3 40-trip books, which they do, then I would take it on good faith
4 that the ferries are talking, you know, within the company about
5 additional discounts for employees. And let's get this approved
6 today. Let them continue to do that. And, you know, perhaps
7 approving these rate increases allows them to then, you know, offer
8 a discount to some employees, you know.

9
10 **LEG. BERLAND:**

11 It's certainly not my intention to tie this up. I just wanted, you
12 know, to get an answer, you know, to the question.

13
14 **LEG. CILMI:**

15 Right.

16
17 **LEG. BERLAND:**

18 So.

19
20 **MR. KAUFMAN:**

21 I'd just like to say one last thing, is that also we put it out
22 there with this rate increase that's coming to any of the
23 businesses who are on Fire Island. You can buy as many books as
24 you want under the old rate and stockpile them. And we'll honor
25 them until they're used. You know, there'd be no expiration date
26 at all.

27
28 **LEG. BERLAND:**

29 Well, is that the usual course? I didn't mean to -- if I can
30 interrupt. Is that the usual course that businesses buy them and
31 then give them to their employees or --

32
33 **MR. KAUFMAN:**

34 A lot of them do, yes. Yep.

35
36 **CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:**

37 Are you satisfied with that or do you want to continue with your
38 tabling motion?

39
40 **LEG. BERLAND:**

41 Well, I -- I don't want to hold it up. So if you think that it
42 shouldn't be tabled, then, you know, then I'd be willing to
43 withdraw that. But in the same -- you know, in the same context if
44 you continue the conversations to extend that lower rate to -- that
45 the contractors get to the summer employees -- I mean, just make it
46 specifically for summer employees. If you're getting a rate
47 increase to be able to let the workers who are working there get
48 that lower rate, I think, is important. How long is this --

49
50 **CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:**

51 The agreement?

52
53 **LEG. BERLAND:**

54 These licenses? These are in effect for how long?

02:17PM

1 **MS. SIMPSON:**
2 The licenses are for five years.

3
4 **LEG. BERLAND:**
5 And the rate increases are?

6
7 **MS. SIMPSON:**
8 It's going to be changed. They can come to us seeking a rate
9 increase at any point in time. So sometimes it's a year. If gas
10 goes up tremendously, it might be one year. If there's not a
11 substantial increase in their costs of doing business, it may be
12 three or four years. It depends on the market.

13
14 **CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:**
15 And don't forget with the cost of minimum wage going up, the cost
16 to run any business, it's just climbing. And that's unavoidable at
17 this point.

18
19 **LEG. BERLAND:**
20 Oh, absolutely. But I would ask -- I'll withdraw my tabling
21 motion. Maybe if you can come to the General Meeting and see if
22 you have had conversations at that point and whether you'd be able
23 to extend or come up with something specifically for, you know, the
24 kids who are working there hourly, you know, hourly employees for
25 the summer to just get some specific rate for them; you know, and
26 let us know at the General Meeting, that would be great. Can you
27 do that?

28
29 **MR. KAUFMAN:**
30 Sure.

31
32 **LEG. BERLAND:**
33 Wonderful. Okay, so then I'll withdraw my tabling motion.

34
