THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER AT 10:38 AM

CHAIRPERSON FLEMING:

Members of the Ways and Means Committee, make your way to the horseshoe. Thank you to the public. We are just waiting for a couple of Legislators and we'll get started.

Good morning. (Gavel) Good morning and welcome to a special meeting of the Ways and Means Committee. The Committee meeting was noticed as follows: Please be advised that there will be a special meeting of the Ways and Means Committee held on Wednesday, January 15th, 2020 at 10:30 AM in the Rose Y. Caracappa Auditorium of the William H. Rogers Legislative Building, 725 Veterans Memorial Highway, Smithtown, New York and the agenda was listed.

We're going to begin the meeting with a Pledge to the Flag led by Legislator Kennedy.

SALUTATION

Thank you. I note that the meeting notice, the agenda did not include public portion. But as is our custom, we welcome public comment. So, I do have a couple of cards. Anyone else who's interested in speaking on any topic at the podium, please feel free to come forward and we'll get you a card. And three minutes at the podium. First is Michelle Ingrassia

MRS. INGRASSIA:

Good morning.

CHAIRPERSON FLEMING:

Good morning.

MRS. INGRASSIA:

This is my second time here. I stumbled across this building because in desperation in my quest to get justice for myself and my family, I was at the DA's office with a civil perjury charge against my husband, which they did investigate, deemed I proved it but chose not to go ahead and prosecute.

I just walked in here and I said "please, help me." They advised me of this meeting. I was here last month and Miss Fleming helped me. Miss Donohue, you got in touch with me and helped me navigate, put me in touch with my Senator. My daughter and I have had very unfortunate incidents with the Fourth Precinct. And I'm currently navigating my complaint reports I have, countless audio of the abuse of the Fourth Precinct to one not knowing my rights or my daughter's rights, but literally falsifying police reports so it renders me useless in Family Court.

And I have been so appalled at the treatment and the inability for a private citizen without a lawyer to navigate the system. My husband has spent over \$250,000 divorcing me. And I was not opposing it. However, I have no money to hire a lawyer and a lawyer won't touch me. I'm currently pro se in the appellate court

1 and I just put in an application for a lawyer.

2
3 I'm here because Mr. Trotta -- I was researching on the Fourth
4 Precinct and I came across your bid for office. And you mention
5 police corruption. I am the face of police corruption that doesn't
6 have a dollar sign attached to it, at least not the County's. It
7 is my freedom and my daughter's freedom and our rights that are
8 being violated by the corrupt police department. And I have them
9 on tape lying to me right up to the Commander. Melanie Martinez
10 put me in touch with the Commander after she heard my audio of the
11 abuse that the Suffolk County police officers -- {Kirch} called me,
12 {Kathy Kirch} and she said "give up your appeal. You're going to
13 lose. They're all in it together."

14
15 I said "can I please come down and can you listen to what I have?"
16 I went to her office. I spent two hours there, all of which time
17 she spoke about her own failed appeal and told me that I was
18 setting my daughter up for failure; that I need to stop and get on
19 with my life. She did not fill out a complaint against the
20 officers who broke my civil right to fill out my own police report
21 even though I -- and they did not enforce the penal code as I was
22 holding it. They wouldn't read it. I haven't heard anything -- on
23 larceny, on aggravated harassment, on perjury.

24
25 And the Suffolk County Police Department and DA are refusing to
26 enforce the law. So that's why I'm here because your bid caught my
27 attention. And I wanted you to see that corruption's not just
28 about dollars and cents. Thank you.

29
30 **CHAIRPERSON FLEMING:**

31 Thank you, Michelle. And, you know, please continue to be in touch
32 with my office so I can get more details about your experience
33 there at the district office. I do note -- sorry. I just said
34 stay in touch with my office and we'll continue to get information
35 about your visit.

37 **MRS. INGRASSIA:**

38 Yes, I agree.

39
40 **CHAIRPERSON FLEMING:**

41 I should note one good piece of news. We got two new judges in the
42 Family Court sworn in couple of days ago. One's an African
43 American woman from the Shinnecock Reservation; another is a female
44 from Town Justice Court. Both pledge to serve constituents in a
45 way that actually serves the constituents. I'm well aware of some
46 shortcomings in the family court system. And so, I'm sorry to hear
47 of your experience, but we'll continue to work with you as we can.

49 And next on the list is Alexa Ingrassia.

51 **MISS INGRASSIA:**

52 Good morning.

53
54 **CHAIRPERSON FLEMING:**

55 Good morning.

1 **MISS INGRASSIA:**

2 I've never really spoke in public before, so don't -- I'm sorry if
3 I'm a little frantic.

4
5 **CHAIRPERSON FLEMING:**

6 You're doing fine.

7
8 **MISS INGRASSIA:**

9 But I just wanted to start off by saying my mom is one of the
10 strongest people I have ever met. She's been through so much.
11 We've been through so much together, and my dad and with the
12 police. I felt very uncomfortable with my dad being in the house
13 because he's done so much and, like, just said so much and I
14 couldn't take his words anymore. I felt a constant pressure to be
15 in that house, afraid of what he would say to me next. And it was
16 a constant thing with him. And luckily my friends have gone
17 through divorce and I know that at 14 you can choose where you want
18 to live. But when I went to -- I needed to get my things because I
19 couldn't handle it anymore. I was like, I'm done, I have to get
20 out of here because I just can't do it.

21
22 And I wanted to get my phone and my stuff. And I texted my dad
23 saying "can I just get it?" And I don't want to get things --
24 people -- like the police involved, but I need my stuff, I just
25 can't be there. So, he ended up saying just bring them. And I
26 came and I kept saying -- I just -- I don't feel comfortable with
27 him. And he tried to force me back into the house when that -- you
28 know, I know that I get to choose where I want to live. It took
29 me, like, at least 30 times to just say I can't, I feel
30 uncomfortable, please don't put me back in the house where he
31 finally made the call and said "actually at 14 you can choose where
32 you want to live." And I ended up getting my things.

33
34 If I didn't know my rights, I don't know what would have happened.
35 If I had to go back in there, I don't know where I'd be today. And
36 I'm so happy that I did because I feel so much happier now and just
37 so much more calm knowing that I don't have to hear those things
38 about my dad anymore and the things that he's done throwing out all
39 our family heirlooms that aren't even his, they're my mom's; threw
40 them in a dumpster and just threw them away. I didn't even tell my
41 mom without notice, broken things he threw in there. And when I
42 told her, I said "did you get your stuff?" And she said "no." And
43 I said "well, it's not there anymore. The dumpster's gone because
44 he kept it there."

45
46 And to my surprise because we just been through so much, I feel
47 like it's just us made stronger, especially her, she just looked at
48 me and she was like "they're just things, Alexa, we can replace
49 them." And I think that just shows her strength and her ability to
50 get through all the stuff. And it's so unfair what they're doing
51 because, you know, we're just people. We're just trying to get our
52 things and live and get our, like, rights. You know, it's just,
53 it's so unfair and I just feel so bad especially for my mom because
54 it's really hard to watch your mom stay in her room for hours and
55 hours trying to put together something she doesn't even know if she
56 could really put to fruition but her hope and her faith in herself

1 and hopefully what the system will be one day is so inspiring. And
2 I'm so lucky, I'm so proud to be her daughter. And I just wanted
3 to say how I hope you can help us because she really is one of the
4 best people I know and she's so unbelievably strong and so smart.
5 And that's all. Thank you.

6
7 **CHAIRPERSON FLEMING:**

8 You're very brave. Thank you very much for your comments. I don't
9 see any questions. Thank you and we'll continue to be in touch.
10 And we wish you all the best. It's important, I think, for us to
11 actually hear of the impacts of processes and particularly in the
12 family arena in the courts. There's a lot of room for improvement.
13 And I think it's helpful to those in policymaking positions to hear
14 from you. So, I appreciate it. I feel for you what you're going
15 through and I do wish you the best and we'll stay in touch. Thank
16 you.

18 **MRS. INGRASSIA:**

19 Have a good night. Thank you so much.

20
21 **CHAIRPERSON FLEMING:**

22 Is there anyone else who'd like to be heard? Okay, so seeing
23 nothing further, we'll move right on in the agenda.

25 **INTRODUCTORY RESOLUTIONS**

27 So, first on the agenda is Introductory Resolutions. Introductory
28 Resolution **1060, Setting date for Special Election to fill vacancy**
29 **in the 15th Legislative District.** That election is listed as being

32 The motion is approved. **(VOTE: 8-0-0-0. PO CALARCO INCLUDED IN**
