And question four, would like to know why \$400,000 of STOA funding went to micro-planning and not directly to operation of the transit system. Micro-planning is not what STOA funding is for. There are other revenue streams for economic development and planning and why was the public ridership not involved in what this money was going to be used for." 23 for me to work with one town to pay the back taxes on parcels and
24 not, you know, treat everyone fairly across the board in the same
25 way. And I told the sponsor this, so. Go ahead, Legislator
26 Berland.

30 gonna be giving over property that at least whoever we're giving it
31 to should pay the back taxes and should continue to pay the taxes
32 on it. I agree with Legislator Krupski, we can't, you know, do it
33 one way for some areas and another way for others. Either it's
34 across the board that we're just gonna not have anybody pay taxes
35 on properties anymore or everybody should pay the taxes. And I
36 kind of prefer the paying the taxes, especially the back taxes for
37 this. So, I can't support this resolution.

IR 1026, Establishing a Coastal Resiliency and Sea Level Rise Task Force. (Krupski). I'll make a motion to approve.

LEG. FLEMING:
I have a question. I didn't, I'm sorry, I didn't see this before maybe we can talk offline as well.

CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:
Sure.

LEG. FLEMING:
But how -- you know, we got the Coastal Resiliency Management Advisory Council that's gonna be advising the effort that we funded at \$200,000 for a consultant to look at long-term coastal resiliency management. That is in DPW now. It's too bad that DPW isn't here to answer questions because it'd be nice to know where that is, the last stop for approving the specs and then they're going out on the street for -- to the RFP. So how is this -- it sounds so similar. How is this gonna act in conjunction or --

CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:
So this is -- this is very immediate. This would be a task force that would meet for one year only. And it would work -- I think it would work towards -- I think the two would work together. So, this is two things: One, this will include all the towns; DPW from the County, County Planning, New York State DOT, New York State DEC. This would address two needs: One is immediate and that people who are the regulatory agencies are -- people apply to them every day for permits, coastal erosion and wetland permits. And so this would get those regulators who have jurisdiction everyday together this year to talk about challenges and common challenges and common solutions to problems.

And the other -- the other goal is more of a long-term goal including the State and County road network and town road network and infrastructure to say where should we spend our money on sea level rise and coastal resiliency. And that's a much broader and longer term discussion. But I felt like we should get this process

1 started. It's going out to an RFP. I'm not sure how long that
2 process would be. And this is more of an immediate conversation to
3 start because mother nature's not waiting. And the sooner we start
4 this conversation, the better.

5
6 **LEG. FLEMING:**

7 Can I just ask that you and -- make an effort to ensure that we
8 don't have competing efforts. I mean, the people who would be
9 involved in the advisory council, which is being established right
10 now for the coastal resiliency management effort, might be the same
11 people. It sounds like it's the same; very similar. So I wonder
12 if -- I know Sarah Lansdale has -- and Bill Hillman, I think, has
13 the -- has it at DPW at the moment but Sarah Lansdale's been
14 shepherding the effort. Can you be sure to have conversations with
15 her to make sure that this isn't a competing effort?

16
17 **CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:**

18 Absolutely, absolutely. And the people that I've spoken to about
19 this have welcomed the effort because it's a condition that every
20 community is facing right now; you know, right now.

21
22 **LEG. FLEMING:**

23 I know, that's why we've been working on this effort.

24
25 **CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:**

26 Yeah.

27
28 **LEG. FLEMING:**

29 Okay, thank you.

30
31 **CHAIRPERSON KRUPSKI:**

32 Sure. Oh, so, I made a motion. Is there a second?
