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1 **CHAIRMAN MCCAFFREY:**

2 Good afternoon, everybody. Welcome to the Education and Labor  
3 committee. Everybody please rise for the Pledge of Allegiance led  
4 by Legislator Kennedy.

5  
6 (Pledge of Allegiance)

7  
8 Thank you. We are still trying to locate the vice chair,  
9 Legislator Gonzalez. We understand he is on his way, but we are  
10 going to proceed. I don't believe we have any correspondence  
11 today. No, we don't. Public portion; do we have any cards?

12  
13 **MS. ELLIS:**

14 No, sir.

15  
16 **CHAIRMAN MCCAFFREY:**

17 Thank you. I see Ben Zwirn in the audience. I'm going to ask him  
18 to come up because I know he made a visit yesterday to Albany,  
19 maybe fill us us in on some of the things going on up in Albany.  
20 We don't need to know all the details.

21  
22 **MR. ZWIRN:**

23 Thank you, Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee. It's a late  
24 happy new year, but this is the first committee meeting of the new  
25 session, so it's good to see everybody. We were up in Albany  
26 yesterday. We brought about 30-some odd students from the  
27 community college. We go up every year to advocate on behalf of  
28 the college as they prepare the state budget as reviewed by the  
29 legislature, and yesterday were the joint hearings for higher  
30 education with respect to the budget. The students got up there  
31 early enough so they could see the chancellor testify before the  
32 higher ed committee and the finance committees, and she was pushing  
33 for the things that we are looking for from the state, which is  
34 floor funding, and I'll explain that in a second, and restoration  
35 of child care, which is a very small -- it's like a million dollars  
36 for all the community colleges so it's not a lot of money and why  
37 the governor doesn't put it in and take credit for it to start the  
38 process, I don't understand, but usually the legislature always  
39 puts it in. And it's an important part at Suffolk Community  
40 College because a lot of the students and even the faculty even  
41 take advantage of the programs take advantage of the programs that  
42 we have on the grant in the Ammerman Campus.

43  
44 Floor funding is that -- would give us the same amount of revenue  
45 that we had last year from the state with enrollment going down a  
46 little bit in increase in FTE aid, which is usually the way state  
47 funds us. They give us \$100 a year. We wind up getting less money  
48 from the state than we did the year before. So if we can get floor  
49 funding so they can just give us what they gave us, that's all  
50 we're looking for, and that's what the chancellor was advocating  
51 yesterday today as well; and the chancellor that they have,  
52 Kristina Johnson, she's really -- she's terrific. She is a star.  
53 She holds a number of patents. She came out of the private sector.  
54 She's a Duke University -- just great.

55  
56 So we went up yesterday. We saw the delegation from Suffolk

1 County. We saw Senator Martinez, who used to chair this committee.  
2 She was great with the students. As they told them their stories,  
3 she could relate. We saw Senator Gaughran, Senator Boyle, Senator  
4 Flanagan, Senator LaValle. We've actually ambushed Senator Anna  
5 Kaplan from Nassau County in the elevator for nine floors. So we  
6 made the pitch because Nassau Community College is in the same  
7 situation as Suffolk, and we're looking for the same things. So  
8 we're going to try to get together with the Nassau people to  
9 advocate together.

10  
11 The students were outstanding. I mean, we have -- and I have  
12 suggested, and I think we're going to do that is get these students  
13 out as ambassadors of the college to go out to bring in additional  
14 students. Nobody tells the story of Suffolk like the kids that are  
15 going there. Some of them are kids, some are veterans, their  
16 parents, they have young children. It is -- they were terrific,  
17 and we had a very good day. The only assemblyman -- we saw  
18 Assemblyman Englebright. We didn't see Assemblyman Thiele, who  
19 represents the eastern district, the eastern campus because the  
20 session went a little bit too late. He was coming over from his  
21 office to the assembly and it didn't work out. We also got a  
22 chance to see the speaker of the assembly, Carl Heastie, who met  
23 with a number of our students, as he does every year; and the  
24 reason he does that -- to get to see the speaker of the assembly is  
25 no small thing -- but he is a graduate of Stony Brook University,  
26 and he went to school with our Title 9 officer Christina Vargas.  
27 They were classmates, they were in student government together,  
28 they were dance partners at one time, and they are still the best  
29 of friends so our students get the benefit of that and they got in  
30 to see the speaker; and one of the other assemblyman came in, took  
31 them into the chamber, and had them pose for pictures at the  
32 speaker's podium, so it was a real thrill for them.

33  
34 We do it every year, and this year was sad a little bit because  
35 he's retiring, and he had been the former chairman of the higher ed  
36 committee for many, many years, and now it's Toby Ann Savitsky from  
37 Queens, but we're still hoping to get the kind of support that we  
38 have in the past. Our capital budget, the three items that we had  
39 on there, which are not really big items, but they were approved in  
40 the governor's proposal.

41  
42 So that's what we did yesterday. The students left early in the  
43 morning, and they came back in the early evening, and I think what  
44 we're trying to do is have some of the students come in and talk to  
45 the committee at some point just to tell their stories, not to ask  
46 for anything, but just some of the stories that they tell are just  
47 heartwarming. They are unbelievable. First generation Americans  
48 coming in here getting an education, the struggles that they face,  
49 and the persistence that they have. They are all going to be  
50 successful because they just won't take no. So that's it in a  
51 nutshell. Everything else at the college is good. The college  
52 search is going on. I can't tell you anything about it because if  
53 I knew, I wouldn't be able to tell you, and I don't know. Lou  
54 Petrizzo is the interim president and he's -- I think he's doing a  
55 great job managing the college, saving money where they can. I  
56 know because people are screaming and yelling that they are saving

1 too much money, but we have a declining enrollment, so we have to  
2 tighten our belts, and I think he has done that. We have a new  
3 finance person who replaced Gail Vizzini. I would like if maybe he  
4 can come in here one day and introduce himself, Mark Harris. He  
5 has a doctorate from Bloomington University in Delaware. He is  
6 commuting right now in Delaware every day. He is there at the  
7 crack of dawn and he's there late at night because I come in early,  
8 and he's there before me.

9  
10 **D.P.O. HAHN:**

11 I have done that. It's not fun.

12  
13 **MR. ZWIRN:**

14 I come in early and he's there before me. He's doing a good job.  
15 He's looking everywhere where he can save. He came from a  
16 community college in New Jersey, so he understands how it works.  
17 I'll answer any questions that I can.

18  
19 **D.P.O. HAHN:**

20 Did you answer -- did you mention the search committee for what's  
21 going on with the search?

22  
23 **MR. ZWIRN:**

24 The only thing I know is that they are supposed to be back in the  
25 summer, June or July, and they are having interviews. There are a  
26 number of people who have applied, and I think they are hoping to  
27 have a selection by July. I think that's why Lou Petrizzo was  
28 planning on ending his time.

29  
30 **D.P.O. HAHN:**

31 As in the person would start in time for the new school year?

32  
33 **MR. ZWIRN:**

34 Fall, yes. I can't tell you that that's going to happen, but I  
35 hear that it's moving forward.

36  
37 **D.P.O. HAHN:**

38 Thank you.

39  
40 **CHAIRMAN MCCAFFREY:**

41 Any other questions? Thank you, Ben, and we would welcome those  
42 students coming in.

43  
44 **MR. ZWIRN:**

45 Yeah, no, I think it would be nice, especially when they are not  
46 coming in to ask for anything, just to tell you -- to say thank  
47 you, really. You guys have been great.

48  
49 **CHAIRMAN MCCAFFREY:**

50 And you can bring Gail in and she can come and ask for the stuff.

51  
52 **MR. ZWIRN:**

53 (Laughter)

54  
55 **CHAIRMAN MCCAFFREY:**

56 Thank you. With that, we have one introductory resolution.

1 **1033, Accepting and appropriating a grant sub-award increase from**  
2 **the Research Foundation for the State University of New York for a**  
3 **project entitled, "Scaling Quantway/Statway in the SUNY System",**  
4 **100% reimbursed by state funds at Suffolk County Community College.**  
5 **(Co. Exec.). I ask for a motion.**

7 **D.P.O. HAHN:**  
8 I'll make a motion and to put on the consent calendar.  
9

10 **LEG. KENNEDY:**  
11 Second.

12  
13 **CHAIRMAN MCCAFFREY:**  
14 All in favor? Opposed? Abstentions? So moved. **Approved/Consent**  
15 **(VOTE: 5-0-0-0).**

17 I don't believe there's anything else to come before the committee.
