18 Just to BR0, when we make facility improvements in general, there's
19 sort of a process either through our Capital Budget or -- how --
20 can you just give me a brief explanation as far as redirecting
21 these pay-go funds and how it's different from monies that we
22 typically use to do these type of things?
23

24 **MR. FREAS:**
25 Based on the notes I have, the funding is effectively a transfer
26 from fund 136, which is the Traffic Violation Bureau fund; so it's
27 a cash -- it's cash that will be used as opposed to bonding for it
28 to do the improvements at TPVA. There's no -- there's no
29 additional cost; there's no debt service.
30

31 **CHAIRPERSON FLEMING:**
32 Okay. So, Legislator Calarco -- I see Rob and I will get to you
33 but Rob may have the answer.
34

35 **P.O. CALARCO:**
36 Just to answer your question, Legislator Spencer, this did go
37 through the Capital Budget process. And when they presented to us,
38 we asked them if they could pay for it themselves and they said
39 yes, *we can*. So that's why it's a pay-go and they're paying for it
40 out of the revenues from the agency as opposed to the bonding.
41

42 **LEG. SPENCER:**
43 I think that's a good idea. Thanks, Craig for your explanation and
44 I think both explanations helped me a lot. I guess when you
45 consider like, for instance, the Police Department and alarm fees,
46 or any other County department where we're providing a fee for
47 service, are we establishing, perhaps, a precedent that some
48 departments that are more revenue-driven have the ability to take
49 money from their operations and use it to improve their buildings?
50 I think it's a good principle, but I also just have a concern that
51 others services, maybe at DSS or other areas that don't generate as
52 much revenue, could it ever be a situation that they wouldn't get
53 the attention that they deserve? You know, it's revenue rich, red
54 red light camera tickets.
55
56

1 **P.O. CALARCO:**

2 It wasn't that the capital -- work group disagreed with the
3 project. It was just a project that was specific to make
4 improvements to, if, I'm not mistaken, I think, it's, you know, an
5 overhang over the building so that when people are coming in,
6 especially if they're waiting in line to get through the metal
7 detectors, they're not stuck sitting out in the rain. And it's
8 other improvements that improve the operations of the organization
9 of TPVA itself. It wasn't that we were against those operations.
10 It was more of if they were able to pay for it out of their own
11 operating budget, it would be more beneficial so that we have
12 capital funds to put towards non-revenue generating agencies like
13 Social Services and what have you.

14
15 **LEG. SPENCER:**

16 Totally agree with it. I think it was a smart way to be able to do
17 it. And I think -- I'm sort of being sloppy, but I think I just
18 got some clarification in my mind of the question I'm asking
19 specifically. If we were to take the improvements that we need to
20 do as a County as a whole, on our buildings and our infrastructure,
21 does this sort of create perhaps where these particular
22 improvements for our ticket-collecting building, would be more
23 accessible to funds than perhaps our buildings that we might use to
24 house some particular social service that we provide that doesn't
25 generate revenue? Does this give them -- you know, how important
26 is this in relationship to all of our buildings and sidewalks and
27 overhangs and things, you know, do the rich get the -- get the
28 improvement?

29
30 (*Laughter*)
31

32 **P.O. CALARCO:**

33 I would argue that we would have supported this project one way or
34 the other. It was just -- we obviously in trying to be physically
35 responsible in doing that, if we're able to identify a way
36 of making it -- we're often told not to bond, not to bond, not to
37 bond, if we're able to find a way to do the improvement that we
38 agreed with. And I think the work group agreed that this was a
39 necessary investment, if we can do it without bonding, we thought
40 it was an appropriate thing to do. Similar to in the past year,
41 the Capital Budget Working Group tried to move purchasing vehicles
42 away from bonding because it is better to not bond for something
43 like a vehicle and to pay for it in the operating budget. Of
44 course, when it came time to do it in the operating budget, it got
45 pushed back. But it is some of the ever going debate what you pay
46 for in cash versus what you pay for in bonds.

47
48 **LEG. SPENCER:**

49 Thanks for the explanation. I am part of the Working Group. I
50 hope I get the privilege of being on the Working Group again. And
51 I do support this. I felt -- I just wanted to get a couple of
52 things on the record. And I think you answered it eloquently.
53 Thank you.

54
55 **CHAIRPERSON FLEMING:**
56 Legislator Trotta.

14 Frequently they come to us from the County Executive's staff after
15 they realize that an error has been made or if some -- our staff,
16 when we are reviewing -- the LADS department in the Clerk's Office
17 reviews every piece of legislation, they try to pick up errors
18 before we pass things but sometimes that's --

20 **CHAIRPERSON FLEMING:**

21 Sure, especially with all the tax map numbers. All right, so we
22 have a motion and a second. All in favor? All opposed? Any
23 abstentions? That motion carries (VOTE: 8-0-0-0. P.O. CALARCO

42 It's just an object number in the Capital Program. So there was
43 one number in a long list of numbers where there was a digit that
44 was incorrect, so we're just correcting that one digit so that it's
45 accurate.
46

47 **LEG. TROTТА:**

48 It's like daylight savings time or leap year, same thing.
49

50 **LEG. KENNEDY:**

51 It was 605 and it went to 39. That's money.
52

53 **MS. SIMPSON:**

54 That change hasn't -- that's not the change. If you look at the
55 actual 1179 it was -- the Capital Project number 5813.111 should
56 have been .110, not -- so that was the only change to the bill.
