45 home-based services for several years now, but previously the
46 program had been provided by the Family Service League. But in
47 2019 Probation asked for an RFP; the RFP was published in
48 mid-August, we received seven proposals and the winning bidder
49 was the EAC.

51 Basically, the home-based programs serve at-risk youth, both PINS
52 children and JD children, seeks to serve those children as well as
53 their families by improving family relationships, mitigating school
54 problems and promoting pro-social, leisure time activities. So the
55 money will be used to provide staff to deliver those services, and
56 the money, \$759,255, is being transferred to support the contract

1 that was awarded to EAC.

2
3 **D.P.O. HAHN:**

4 So you said that originally it had been provided by another --
5 by Family Service League; is that what you had said?

6
7 **DIRECTOR NEUBAUER:**

8 That is correct.

9

11 And that ended because -- I'm sorry if I'm making you repeat that,
12 I just want to make sure I'm following correctly. Why did that
13 contract end with Family Service League?

14

16 Well, it was a three-year contract, that it had been delivering the
17 services for a period of time and the Probation Department thought
18 it prudent to issue an RFP. And we did, in fact, get seven
19 proposals, so there was a great deal of interest in delivering the

23 Okay. And what else does EAC do? I know that they have other
24 contracts with us, correct?

25
26 **DIRECTOR NEUBAUER:**

27 They have other contracts with the County; yes, that's correct.

28

08:45AM 30 And those -- Rob, was it your legislation that created a review of
31 our contract agencies in this area?

32
33 **P.O. CALARCO:**

34 Well, when I was Chair of the Budget Committee we did an extensive
35 review of all contract agencies, and I think we had EAC come in at
36 one point in time as well as Family Service League to talk about
37 their programs and what they were providing. I think EAC maybe has
38 popped up in the past because, if I'm not mistaken, TASC is a
39 subsidiary of them or a program that they run and that was
08:46AM 40 discussed when we were looking at the alternatives to incarceration
41 programs.

42

44 Right, there were some problems with TASC. I was trying to
45 remember why this -- you know, why there was like a red flag going
46 off in my head about this one. So -- okay. And that's a lot of
47 money to, you know, switch hands from one organization to another.

49 to their services?
