THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER AT 1:17 PM

P.O. CALARCO:

Okay, good, we are all here. We're gonna get started with our committee. If we could all please rise for the Pledge of Allegiance led by Legislator Berland.

SALUTATION

Okay, Legislator Berland, you wanted to make a motion for a moment of silence.

CHAIRPERSON BERLAND:

Yes, thank you, Presiding Officer. If we could all just take a moment. This is -- May is Military Appreciation Month so during this month especially let us pause to recognize, honor, celebrate and thank the courageous men and women who have served or are currently serving in the United States Armed Forces.

Let us also remember all those men and women who have lost their lives in service to our country and those who continue to sacrifice to ensure --

And also let us -- Rob?

P.O. CALARCO:

I muted them.

CHAIRPERSON BERLAND:

Okay. (**Laughter**) And also let us pause to remember in our hearts all the members of our military and our veterans who we have lost to this pandemic and their families as well as all those we have lost in Suffolk County and the entire world. So to all of the families we know you're in need of our thoughts and prayers during this most difficult time and we offer them to you.

MOMENT OF SILENCE OBSERVED

Thank you.

P.O. CALARCO:

Thank you, Legislator Berland for that moment of silence.

Okay, welcome, everyone to the Veterans and the Consumer Affairs Committee today. We continue to operate via Zoom as per Governor's Executive Order. He extended the waiver to the Open Meeting's Law to allow this format. And accordingly, as Presiding Officer, I will be chairing the committees this week to allow our committee chairs to not have to come to the Legislative building. And I thank Legislator Berland for her deference here this morning.

So we're gonna go right into our agenda. We also will not be having any public portion as per the Governor's Executive Order. We do not have any correspondence.

1 Legislator Berland had asked for Fred Sganga from the Veterans Home
2 to be here today to give us a presentation about issues that they
3 are facing there. Unfortunately, he is unable to join us today
4 because they are dealing with the crisis and some changes that the
5 State has recently put down, but he did provide Legislator Berland
6 with an update and so I'm going to hand it off to Legislator
7 Berland so she can provide us with that information.
8

9 **CHAIRPERSON BERLAND:**

01:20PM 10 Thank you, Presiding Officer. Yes, Fred Sganga was going to be
11 here this morning to give an update on the Veterans Home, the Long
12 Island State Veterans Home. There's a new Executive Order that was
13 just released that requires all nursing homes to test staff twice a
14 week. So they're working diligently to try to implement that now
15 in the time frame required, which is why he's not here with us
16 right now.
17

01:21PM 18 But since March 10th, they've had 149 total positive cases at the
19 Long Island State Veterans Home. Currently, they have 82 who are
20 positive and 80 are still -- 80 are being treated at the home, two
21 are being treated at Stony Brook. And of those who are positive,
22 48 have recovered but are still being monitored at the home.
23 Unfortunately, they lost 67 residents who passed away from
24 COVID-19. All of them who succumbed to the virus had multiple
25 comorbidities but clearly that does not make the loss any less.
26

01:21PM 27 They have a palliative care partner at Good Shepard Hospice.
28 They're offering virtual bereavement groups to all of the families
29 for support. They have and will continue to test asymptomatic
30 residents. They have -- they got a number of available testing
31 kits that -- the number increased so they're going to be testing
32 asymptomatic people as well. They tested over 90 residents who
33 have had no symptoms so far. They anticipate down the road they'll
34 probably have more positive residents but currently none other than
35 the ones I mentioned are showing symptoms.
36

01:22PM 37 As of Friday, 150 of their 675 employees had been tested.
38 Sixty-six tested positive; 79 tested negative; and 40 of those who
39 tested positive have already recovered and returned to work. Fred
40 and his team were working diligently to comply with the new order
41 that's gonna make sure that people get tested, their staff gets
42 tested twice a week.
43

44 They had some PPE issues at the beginning but they're -- they have
45 a adequate reply -- supply as of last Thursday. They received a
46 major delivery of the disposable isolation gowns, which is what
47 they really needed so they should be good for the next few weeks
48 and people continue to make donations daily to them.
49

01:22PM 50 Fred also wanted me to tell you about two research programs that
51 they're working with because they are affiliated closely with Stony
52 Brook University. So there's two new trials. There's an antibody
53 infusion trial for newly diagnosed residents and also for --
54 there's a second study involving a new point-of-care testing unit
55 that will allow for the rapid testing for the virus. So they're
56 working in conjunction with Stony Brook. They're getting all the

1 proper consent forms and healthcare proxies and working with all
2 the families and trying to, you know, do their part to keep our
3 veterans safe and keep the families informed. They have put all
4 kinds of letters out on their websites, updating from the beginning
5 what they're doing to help the residents. So if anybody wants to
6 look on the, you know, Long Island State Veterans Home website you
7 can see all of the letters that they've posted from the start.
8 They've been very open and aboveboard and, you know, given all the
9 information to the families who've requested it.

10
11 So, you know, I want to thank Fred for the work he's doing and look
12 forward to seeing him in person. Thank you, Presiding Officer.

13
14 **P.O. CALARCO:**

15 Thank you so much for getting that update for us, Legislator
16 Berland. Legislator Krupski had a question.

17
18 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

19 You said that hospice is there -- there in the building?
20

21 **CHAIRPERSON BERLAND:**

22 No, they're doing what's an online hospice with the families to --
23

24 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

25 Oh, wonderful.
26

27 **CHAIRPERSON BERLAND:**

28 -- you know, the bereavement groups.
29

30 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

31 Oh, that's wonderful.
32

33 **CHAIRPERSON BERLAND:**

34 Bereavement groups.
35

36 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

37 I can't say enough about hospice, that's great, that's a great
38 service.
39

40 **CHAIRPERSON BERLAND:**

41 Yeah.
42

43 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

44 Thank you.
45

46 **CHAIRPERSON BERLAND:**

47 Sure.
48

49 **P.O. CALARCO:**

50 Okay, Legislator Muratore.
51

52 **LEG. MURATORE:**

53 For the -- the Chairman, what's the population of the Vets Home,
54 how many residents do they have, do you know?

2 It's a little bit over 300, I think.

5 Over 300. As beds are opening because people are either moving out
6 or passing on; are they filling those beds, are they bringing new
7 patients in?

01:24PM 10 You know, I don't want answer either way because I don't know. I
11 assume if somebody needs a bed they'll take them but, you know, I
12 don't know. I think all nursing homes are still taking people.
13 You know, now -- now the directives has changed whether, you know,
14 if you're positive or not; if you were positive they were told you
15 had to go back to the nursing home. So now they're looking to put
16 the people who are positive in specific, you know, COVID
17 environments, so, I'm not quite sure but I can check with Fred and
18 let you know.

19
20 **LEG. MURATORE:**

21 Okay, good, thank you. Thank you, Madam Chair.

22
23 **P.O. CALARCO:**

24 Okay. Anybody else have any questions?

25
26 Okay, Legislator Berland, thank you very much for getting that

26 So the State very recently authorized the allowance of an
27 additional five days to military reservists who have health issues
28 that need extra time based on their active service while they're
29 County employees or while they're municipal employees. And each
01:28PM 30 municipality had the option to waive in or not. So it's -- it's
31 separate -- it's little bit of an addition to the collective
32 bargaining specifically because these individuals are military
33 reservists who get called into active service and then come back to
34 County employment.
