RESOLUTION NO. 833-2020, ACCEPTING A GIFT OF BICYCLES FROM GARY TEICH FOR USE BY THE SUFFOLK COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, the Suffolk County Police Department has specially trained bicycle patrols; and

WHEREAS, the bike patrols allow the Suffolk County Police Department to have a community presence; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department is in need of new bicycles; and

WHEREAS, Gary Teich, Owner of Lees Auto Body wishes to donate bicycles consistent with Suffolk County Police Department standards for bike trained officers; and

WHEREAS, the Suffolk County Police Department will obtain bicycles on a rolling basis at no direct cost to the County via the donations; and

WHEREAS, the Police Commissioner finds that this donation will enable the Department to keep its officers safe and healthy while they continue to serve with a community presence; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that the donation of bicycles on a rolling basis, for the Suffolk County Police Department is hereby accepted; and be it further

2nd RESOLVED, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA") lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action, pursuant to Section 617.5 (c) (20), (21) and (27) of Title 6 of the New York Code of Rules and Regulations ("NYCRR"), and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the New York Environmental Conservation Law as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
