BOND RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY OF SUFFOLK, NEW YORK, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$500,000 BONDS TO FINANCE THE STABILIZATION, PRESERVATION AND RESTORATION OF HISTORIC STRUCTURES AND BUILDINGS AT COUNTY PARKS, HISTORIC RESTORATION AND PRESERVATION FUND (CP 7510.348)

The class of objects or purposes for which the bonds are authorized is the stabilization, preservation and restoration of historic structures and buildings at County Parks funded through the Historic Restoration and Preservation Fund, at the estimated maximum cost of \$500,000.

The amount of obligations authorized to be issued is \$500,000.

The period of probable usefulness of the bonds is ten (10) years.

A complete copy of the Bond Resolution summarized above shall be available for public inspection during normal business hours at the office of the Clerk of the Legislature, W.H. Rogers Legislature Building, 725 Veterans Memorial Highway, Smithtown, New York.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Suffolk County Legislature has passed Introductory Resolution No. 1347-2020 “A Local Law Requiring Animal Shelters and Rescues to Provide an Animal’s Behavioral and Bite History Prior to Adoption,” which law requires that animal shelters and rescues maintain records on the behavioral history of each animal which shall include: a report on the behavioral disposition of the animal upon entering the animal shelter or animal rescue; weekly documentation of the behavioral characteristics including specific concerns or incidents of the animal; and a monthly summary of any changes to the animal’s behavior including bites and other negative behavioral incidents. This law also requires that animal shelters and rescues disclose in writing, for all dogs aged four months or older with known bite histories involving a person or another animal, a detailed bite history to all persons interested in adopting the dog and obtain a signed acknowledgment from the person adopting the dog that he or she has been provided with information about the dog’s bite history. In addition, this law requires all animal shelters and animal rescues to provide an individual considering an animal adoption with all written behavioral and bite history records at least twenty four hours prior to animal being adopted bartered or given away.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Suffolk County Legislature has passed Introductory Resolution No. 1530-2020 “A Charter Law to Further Expedite the Consideration of Grant Funding Resolutions by the Legislature,” which law creates a procedure for approval of grant fund resolutions to be effectuated via a single vote.
