

**RESOLUTION NO. 498-2021, AMENDING THE 2021 OPERATING BUDGET TO REFLECT THE ESTIMATED 2020 INTERFUND TRANSFER AS ADOPTED IN THE 2021 OPERATING BUDGET, ALLOCATE FUNDING TO FUND 193 HOTEL MOTEL ARTS AND CULTURAL PROGRAMMING RESERVE FUND AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR CULTURAL ARTS PROGRAMMING**

**WHEREAS**, Local Law No. 41-2020 established a limited reserve fund for organizations which receive funding from the County's tax on hotel and motel occupancy to provide cultural arts programming in relation to the COVID-19 pandemic; and

**WHEREAS**, cultural organizations which have unexpended funds from 2020 should have their funds allocated for use this year in addition to any funds allocated in the 2021 Operating Budget; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2021 Adopted Operating Budget reduced the 2020 Fund 192 estimated Interfund transfer to the General Fund from \$4,519,155 to \$1,889,659; and

**WHEREAS**, Resolution No. 826-2020 directed the County Comptroller to perform a detailed accounting of the funds remaining in Fund 192 and upon finalizing the fund balance at the close of 2020 to deposit monies in to Fund 193 established via Local Law No. 41-2020; and

**WHEREAS**, Section C4-31 (G) of the Suffolk County Charter allows amendment of the County Operating Budget by County Legislators four times during the fiscal year as long as the amendment reduces, lowers, terminates or cancels appropriations; abolishes positions of employment; terminates contract agencies; terminates or reduces the size of County programs or departments, or makes transfers of appropriations that are offset by reductions in other appropriations; now, therefore be it

**1st RESOLVED**, that the County Comptroller is hereby directed to transfer funds as adopted in the 2021 County Operating Budget to properly reflect the 2020 estimated interfund transfer as follows;

**5th RESOLVED**, that the actions taken in this Resolution are unique and specific to the fiscal years 2020 and 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic and shall serve as having no precedential effect for any future actions in these or any other fiscal years; and be it further

**6th RESOLVED**, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(26) and (33) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW insofar as these actions constitute routine or continuing administration and management not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
