RE: Proposed Revised Indian Island Tidal Wetland Restoration Project, Indian Island County Park, Town of Riverhead

At its April 14, 2021 meeting, the CEQ reviewed the above referenced matter. Pursuant to Chapter 450 of the Suffolk County Code, and based on the information received, as well as information provided at the meeting by Tom Iwanejko, Superintendent of the Division of Vector Control with the Suffolk County Department of Public Works, Camilo Salazar, Senior Environmental Analyst with Suffolk County Department of Economic Development and Planning and Keith Masseria with L.K. McLean Associates, P.C, the Council advises the Suffolk County Legislature and County Executive, in CEQ Resolution No. 15-2021, a copy of which is attached, that the proposed project be considered a Type I Action under SEQRA that will not have significant adverse impacts on the environment.

If the Legislature concurs with the Council on Environmental Quality's recommendation that the project will not have a significant adverse impact on the environment, the Presiding Officer should cause to be brought before the Legislature for a vote, a resolution determining that the proposed action is a Type I Action pursuant to SEQRA that will not have significant adverse impacts on the environment (negative declaration). However, if the Legislature has further environmental concerns regarding this project and needs additional information, the Presiding Officer should remand the case back to the initiating unit for the necessary changes to the project and EAF or submit a resolution authorizing the initiating unit to prepare a draft environmental impact statement (positive declaration).

**CEQ RESOLUTION NO. 15-2021, RECOMMENDATION CONCERNING
A SEQRA CLASSIFICATION AND DETERMINATION FOR THE
PURPOSES OF CHAPTER 450 OF THE SUFFOLK COUNTY CODE FOR
THE PROPOSED REVISED INDIAN ISLAND TIDAL WETLAND
RESTORATION PROJECT, INDIAN ISLAND COUNTY PARK, TOWN OF
RIVERHEAD**

WHEREAS, at its April 14, 2021 meeting, the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) reviewed the EAF and associated information submitted by the Suffolk County Department of Public Works, Division of Vector Control; and

WHEREAS, a presentation regarding the proposal was given at the meeting by Tom Iwanejko, Superintendent of the Division of Vector Control with the Suffolk County Department of Public Works, Camilo Salazar, Senior Environmental Analyst with Suffolk County Department of Economic Development and Planning and Keith Masseria with L.K. McLean Associates, P.C.; and

WHEREAS, the presentation to the CEQ included information on the project design, the soil sampling that was done as part of the project planning process and the overall intent of the project; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project (aka the proposed action) involves a revised tidal wetland restoration project to be located in an area of Indian Island County Park that was a historic tidal wetland but was filled with dredge spoil material in the 1960s and 1970s; and

WHEREAS, as part of the project planning process, soil sampling was completed and the results were analyzed by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation to inform the project design process; and

WHEREAS, to restore the tidal wetland, the project proposes to dredge the old channel between Terry's Creek and the historic tidal wetland area in the interior of the park and to install a box culvert beneath an existing Park roadway; and

WHEREAS, the excavated soil will be placed adjacent to the channel in a berm and new clean fill material will be brought to the site to cap the berm and the bottom of the new channel; and

WHEREAS, the proposed channel and adjacent area will be planted with native wetland species; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the environmental benefits associated with this tidal wetland restoration, this project is also intended to reduce the need for larviciding in the project area to control mosquitos; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that based on the information received and presented, a quorum of the CEQ hereby recommends to the Suffolk County Legislature and County Executive that the proposed action be classified as a Type I Action under the provisions of Title 6 NYCRR Part 617 and Chapter 450 of the Suffolk County Code; and, be it further

2nd RESOLVED, that based on the information received, a quorum of the CEQ recommends to the Suffolk County Legislature and County Executive, pursuant to Title 6 NYCRR Part 617 and Chapter 450 of the Suffolk County Code, that the proposed action will not have significant adverse impacts on the environment for the following reasons:

1. the proposed action will not exceed any of the criteria set forth in Title 6 NYCRR Part 617.7 which sets forth thresholds for determining significant effect on the environment, as demonstrated in the Environmental Assessment Form;
2. the proposal does not appear to significantly threaten any unique or highly valuable environmental or cultural resources as identified in or regulated by the Environmental Conservation Law of the State of New York or the Suffolk County Charter and Code;
3. the proposed action is expected to reduce the need for larviciding that is done in the project area to control for mosquitoes;
4. this project is listed as a priority in the Peconic Estuary Partnership's 2020 Comprehensive Conservation and Management Plan;
5. all required regulatory permits/approvals from New York State Department of Environmental Conservation as well as from all other applicable Federal, State and Local regulatory agencies will be obtained prior to project construction;
6. the proposed action will restore a historic tidal wetland area which will result in a number of ecological benefits including improvements to water quality, nutrient cycling and tidal wetlands habitat; and be it further

3rd RESOLVED, that it is the recommendation of the Council that the Legislature and County Executive adopt a SEQRA determination of non-significance (negative declaration).
