

**RESOLUTION NO. 654-2021, RENAMING THE SHERIFF'S
OFFICE PERSONNEL INVESTIGATIONS BUREAU BUILDING
IN HONOR OF SERGEANT KEITH ALLISON**

WHEREAS, Keith Allison was a 25-year veteran of the Suffolk County Sheriff's Office when he passed away on December 17, 2020 at the age of 52 from COVID-19, leaving behind a legacy of commitment to his family and the Sheriff's Office; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Allison began his career with the Sheriff's Office in 1995 and celebrated his 25th year of service with the County in February of 2020; and

WHEREAS, after a short period of time as a correction officer at the Riverhead Correctional Facility, Mr. Allison began working for the Personnel Investigations Bureau, conducting background investigations and interviews for new employees, both uniformed and civilian; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Allison later became the commanding officer of the Personnel Investigations Bureau and was promoted to Investigator Sergeant in 2018; and

WHEREAS, it would be fitting to name the Sheriff's Office Personnel Investigations Bureau Building in honor of Investigator Sergeant Keith Allison to acknowledge his distinguished career with the Suffolk County Sheriff's Office as someone who was deeply committed to helping the employees of the Sheriff's office through the hiring process; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 215(1) of NEW YORK COUNTY LAW, the Sheriff's Office Personnel Investigations Building is hereby designated and renamed "Sergeant Keith Allison Building"; and be it further

2nd RESOLVED, that the Department of Public Works is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to take all actions necessary to effectuate this naming; and be it further

3rd RESOLVED, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(26) and (33) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW insofar as these actions constitute routine or continuing administration and management not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
