26 up and tell us a little bit about yourself?

27  
28 **MR. VINOGROSKI:**

29 Thank you for the opportunity to speak. Good morning, everyone.  
30 Edward Vinogroski. Don't worry. Through my whole life.

31  
32 **CHAIRMAN THORNE:**

33 I did try, sir.

34  
35 **MR. VINOGROSKI:**

36 Okay. Just a brief. Been a volunteer firefighter for 29 years  
37 living in Lynbrook where I obtained the rank of rescue lieutenant.  
38 The rest is in Bohemia Fire Department where I went through the  
39 ranks, was chief for three straight years and assistant chief six  
40 consecutive years. I was on the Town of Islip fire marshall's  
41 office with the HAZMAT team 14. I am right now currently the task  
42 force leader for the Suffolk County USAR team, Urban Search And  
43 Rescue team. I am right now presently with the fire department  
44 doing the training considering them, and I just would love to be  
45 appointed for the FRES commission.

47 **CHAIRMAN THORNE:**

48 Let me thank you for your opportunity to stand up. As we all know,  
49 it's an unpaid position but a very important one here in the  
50 county. Any questions for the chief? Hearing none, we have a  
51 first and a second. All in favor?
