3 **CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

4 Okay, we are now going to start the Ways and Means Committee  
5 meeting for June 1st. Please rise for the Pledge of Allegiance led  
6 by Legislator Kennedy.

11 Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Roll call, please.

36 **CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

37 Mr. Clerk, do we have any correspondence?

38  
39 **CLERK TASSONE:**

40 All correspondence have been distributed accordingly, Mr. Chairman.

41  
42 **PUBLIC PORTION**

43  
44 **CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

45 Thank you. Our public portion will start. We have Mr. Steve  
46 Gillan is number first and Barbara is up -- Cataletto is up second.  
47 Mr. Gillan?

48  
49 **STEVEN GILLAN:**

50 Good afternoon. My name is Steve Gillan. I'm from Manorville.  
51 I'm also the Director of Legislative Affairs for New York Citizens  
52 Audit. I had the opportunity to watch your last meeting with our  
53 members and you guys asked some very good questions based on the  
54 information that you were supplied. I'm here to pretty much say  
55 that a lot of those questions we know the answers to, obviously.  
56 It was brought up about but not being allowed to vote in one town

1 and drive from Smithtown to Babylon and vote again. Obviously we  
2 know that that can't be done. That brings us into the whole issue.  
3 And the whole issue is that these clones are created. The home --  
4 the person, the voter has no idea. Before we went to Albany, and,  
5 again, I've been up in Albany since January trying to get  
6 legislation passed to have a full end-to-end audit done of the 2020  
7 elections. The big thing with that is that people don't know that  
8 they're clones. They have no idea. So when there's talk about  
9 possibly giving it to the Sheriff, the numbers to the Sheriff and  
01:18PM 10 so forth, things of that nature so somebody could be prosecuted,  
11 these people have no idea.

12  
13 Up in Albany you have -- we have 7% of the Assembly, I had the  
14 whole Assembly researched by our research team to find out how many  
15 of them are clones. You have 7% of the Assembly are actual clones.  
16 You have two Assembly members that have three voter IDs and voted  
17 three times in '16, '18 and '20, all right. They have no idea.  
18 Obviously when we were up in Albany, we brought it to their  
19 attention. They had no idea that this was the situation. Because  
01:18PM 20 what has happened is that these clones are being created either  
21 with real people or people fictitious. The last time that they  
22 were here, they spoke about Mr. M, 25 alert registrations, okay, in  
23 25 different counties registered within two days. All right. Mr.  
24 M doesn't even exist in New York State.

25  
26 So there's all these different scenarios that are taking place that  
27 people have no idea. We go to one number that is showed on our  
28 summary sheet and in our deficits report, that there's 2.4 million  
29 registrations attached to 1.1 million people. So it's 1.3 million  
01:19PM 30 additional registrations that are there. Now, we talked about  
31 proof, where's the proof? All this data that we have is from the  
32 New York State Board of Elections own voter rolls. We go in and we  
33 research and we could see the voting history of that person; of  
34 every person that voted in New York State. We then compare it to  
35 when we find the clones based on like you were told address, age,  
36 name, we see the changes. We have people doing thousands of man  
37 hours that are looking at all these scenarios, all right, to  
38 determine before we send out a canvasser to go out and check with  
39 the people themselves.

40  
41 So we verified all our data. The biggest thing that has come out  
42 since last week, we had our head of research, just was published  
43 last week in a major science --

44  
45 **CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

46 Your three minutes are up but I do have a question. I just want to  
47 pinpoint an exact question. So you're telling me there's a state  
48 assemblyman who voted three separate times from the same address?

49  
50 **STEVEN GILLAN:**

51 Two of them. Two of them. And they have no idea. They have no  
52 idea. That's where the algorithms come into play.

53  
54 **CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

55 Just stop, stop. There's two state assemblymen who voted three  
56 times each with the same address?

**STEVEN GILLAN:**

Correct.

**CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

Do me a favor. We'll cut through all this. Just call my office, come and see me and show it to me.

**STEVEN GILLAN:**

We can't. Okay.

**CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

Can't?

**STEVEN GILLAN:**

We signed an agreement with the New York State Board of Election that we cannot supply the names. All right. That's an agreement. That's privacy paper.

**CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

And you can't not do that.

**LEG. PICCIRILLO:**

Three times they broke the law.

**STEVEN GILLAN:**

They do not know that it's happening to them. That is the whole point. The algorithms --

**CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

Stop. What you just said makes no logical sense and you lose credibility.

**STEVEN GILLAN:**

Go ahead.

**CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

You can't -- that's public information. The voting records are public information. So the fact that you tell me you can't show me now just, you went from here to here (indicating).

**STEVEN GILLAN:**

We have the information. And I will check with our attorney to make sure that --

**CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

Thank you very much.

**STEVEN GILLAN:**

I will supply the information.

**CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

Okay. Next we have Barbara Cataletto.

(Unidentified people speaking from the audience)

1 **CLERK TASSONE:**

2 Mr. Chairman, if anybody, member of the public wants to speak just  
3 please if they can fill out a card and identify their names and  
4 come to the podium.

5  
6 **AUDIENCE:**

7 Sorry.

8  
9 **CLERK TASSONE:**

10 That's okay.

11  
12 **BARBARA CATALETTO:**

13 Good afternoon. Barbara Cataletto. Miss Fleming, let me apologize  
14 for not making the appointment yesterday. I thought that somebody  
15 canceled and there was a mixup so I apologize.

16  
17 **LEG. FLEMING:**

18 Okay, I was waiting for you.

19  
20 **BARBARA CATALETTO:**

21 I know, I know, I'm sorry about that.

22  
23 Once again, thank you for your time to present to continued  
24 information regarding the findings of New York Citizens Audit Study  
25 in Deficits. Last time we met we were able to produce and deliver  
26 these documents to you for the first time, and grant it, although  
27 16 pages of this document contain -- there's only 16 pages in this  
28 document, it contains a significant amount of information that we  
29 have found. I am quite sure that -- it was quite confounding to  
30 understand the information that was presented as it was only in  
31 parts. And there are a lot of questions that you had and that's  
32 totally understandable. To that end we are here to respond to  
33 those questions as best as we can. We are not election experts; we  
34 are not politicians; we are not election board workers with the  
35 exception of some poll workers inspectors, but we are educated Long  
36 Island citizens who care deeply about our community, want to  
37 protect them, preserve our sovereignty as people, as a community  
38 and a state.

39  
40 And with that, let me give you some of the information that you had  
41 asked for. Upon leaving we communicated about the best ways to  
42 respond to your questions. That meant that we would have to go  
43 through the video to list out all of the questions that you had.  
44 This took many hours to do. We went through the task of  
45 researching answers and that's where this gets interesting. It  
46 took up series of hours to go through different locations on the  
47 internet looking for election information from New York State and  
48 also from the Suffolk County Board of Election.

49  
50 As you know working with the internet takes hours and it brings you  
51 to many different venues as you're looking for what you need to  
52 find. Fortunately I was able to reach a representative of New York  
53 State Board of Elections as well as a separate individual of  
54 Suffolk County Board of Election. I will say that the information  
55 they provided was minimal but I think genuine in trying to assist  
56 us in finding the information that we needed relative to the

1 questions presented. Most of the information required has been  
2 requested from the Suffolk Board of Elections. And we have to do  
3 that by FOIL or by letter or e-mail. There's literally no  
4 information about how the process works available to the public.  
5 There's overall general information on voting, on how to vote, how  
6 to register to vote and so on. But asking straightforward  
7 questions such as requesting general information on protocols for  
8 absentee ballots and stuff, the county requires a FOIL. The person  
9 tried to guide me through the FOIL request in Suffolk County. They  
10 couldn't even find the FOIL form. So I had to send out an e-mail  
11 request for a FOIL to ask for information from Suffolk County.

13 When working with the New York State Board of Elections I was  
14 fortunate enough to meet a representative who gave me a little bit  
15 more guidance when how to obtain information. I was informed that  
16 these are in state documents and that I have to direct all of my  
17 questions to the counties. But there are some guidance documents  
18 available from the state to the counties. With that I had to write  
19 a FOIL to the state for the guidance items and I had to write to  
20 the Board of Elections. Question one: Can you be registered --  
21 can you register to vote in two states? Yes. Can you vote in two  
22 states? Thirty two states and Washington DC prohibit it and New  
23 York is part of that.

25 **CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

26 Okay. You went through this whole thing and just described the  
27 FOIL process.

28  
29 **BARBARA CATALETTO:**

30 Because you can't get any information without doing a FOIL.

32 **CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

33 Well, I FOIL things from the Board of Elections.

34  
35 **BARBARA CATALETTO:**

36 Right.

37  
38 **CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

39 And to be honest with you, it was the most easy thing I've ever  
40 done in my life. I went out there. They hand you a form, you fill  
41 it out and they give it to you.

43 **BARBARA CATALETTO:**

44 Yes. So I was told to go to the website. I went to the website  
45 through -- having a conversation with the person. On the phone  
46 with the person, there was no FOIL. I had to e-mail them for the  
47 FOIL.

48  
49 **CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

50 I have no further questions. Thank you. Next we have Denise  
51 Olexa.

52  
53 **DENISE OLEXA:**

54 Hi, I'm Denise Olexa. New York Citizens Audit is working with  
55 Andrew Paquette, PhD, a/k/a Art Zark, a brilliant cyber  
56 intelligence expert. He discovered four algorithms in the New York

1 State voter rolls also known as NYSVoter. The algorithms found in  
2 the data bases link county voter identification and state board of  
3 elections ID numbers in such a way that it could be used as a third  
4 ID number, which then could be used to clandestinely tag and track  
5 records of interest such as phantom voters. Every county official  
6 that Dr. Paquette spoke with about this subject stated that they  
7 had no idea the algorithms existed. None had seen any sign of  
8 their existence prior to these findings. The algorithms perform no  
9 security function and they were not designed to optimize database  
10 performance.

11  
12 Regardless fictitious records and votes, clone records and deletion  
13 of records all violate the law. We know election fraud occurred.  
14 There is too much evidence to deny it with any credibility.  
15 Whoever is responsible for this algorithm is deliberately or  
16 negligently violating the law on a systemic and regular basis. Dr.  
17 Paquette's findings about New York's voter roll algorithms were  
18 recently peer-reviewed and published in a scientific journal, the  
19 Journal of Information Warfare. What is most significant about  
20 this peer-reviewed article is, proves that the manipulation present  
21 in the NYSVoter data base right now is a scientific fact. It  
22 provides an explanation of the inaccuracies and irregularities. It  
23 proves a total loss of control data breach, the most severe kind of  
24 data breach recognized by our federal government. The law says it  
25 renders the affected NYS data base completely untrustworthy. It  
26 proves that the New York Citizens Research Team data is solid,  
27 reliable and can be replicated. It is not based on opinion and  
28 conjecture. It proves that New York State election officials  
29 certified provably inaccurate elections. They ignored New York  
30 Citizens' notification of the 2020 election irregularities and  
31 proceeded to run and certify the 2022 election. This is against  
32 the blackletter rule of law. We ask that you support this effort  
33 by signing a resolution for audit.

35 **CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

36 Legislator -- Legislator Piccirillo has a question.

37  
38 **LEG. PICCIRILLO:**

39 Hi, ma'am. How are you? Good afternoon.

40  
41 **DENISE OLEXA:**

42 Good. How are you?

43  
44 **LEG. PICCIRILLO:**

45 Thank you for coming today and testifying. Why haven't you taken  
46 this to court yet? Do you have a lawyer? Are you in front of a  
47 judge? Have you shown the findings to a judge? Is there a hearing  
48 set?

49  
50 **DENISE OLEXA:**

51 Not yet. We're working on that, working to get that going.  
52 That's, you know --

53  
54 **LEG. PICCIRILLO:**

55 Because, I mean, your words, not mine, you have irrefutable proof  
56 that this happened. I had asked a question at the last hearing

1 when one of the speakers came up and said that 60,000 duplicate  
2 votes were -- 60,000 duplicate voter ID numbers were present. Then  
3 I asked how many of those 60,000 voted and I got the answer of 388,  
4 I believe, someone can correct my math if I'm wrong. And then I  
5 had asked "well, in 2020, were you aware that the law allowed for  
6 absentee voting and ballot voting and then one of those votes would  
7 be thrown away." Are you aware of that?

8  
9 **DENISE OLEXA:**

01:29PM 10 We're getting into, like, numbers, all these numbers. And the  
11 issue is there's algorithms confirmed now scientifically in the  
12 NYSVoter roll database. That's the issue. And, therefore, an  
13 audit --

14  
15 **LEG. PICCIRILLO:**

16 But that's something that needs to be adjudicated in the court of  
17 law, though.

18  
19 **DENISE OLEXA:**

01:29PM 20 Well, it's been scientifically, you know, proven, backed up by  
21 peer-reviewed -- these are not -- you know, these are experts in  
22 the field who have peer-reviewed and scientifically confirmed them  
23 and actually reverse engineered --

24  
25 **LEG. PICCIRILLO:**

26 That may well be true.

27  
28 **DENISE OLEXA:**

29 So the proof is there.

30  
31 **LEG. PICCIRILLO:**

32 Yeah.

33  
34 **DENISE OLEXA:**

35 Then, you know, the next part would be a legal, you know --

36  
37 **LEG. PICCIRILLO:**

38 That's what I'm trying to get to. You know, you gotta get this  
39 into court because, I mean, that's where --

40  
41 **DENISE OLEXA:**

42 Right.

43  
44 **LEG. PICCIRILLO:**

45 -- it's going to be adjudicated.

46  
47 **DENISE OLEXA:**

48 What we're asking now is support from our local towns and counties  
49 to support an audit. Because an audit, of course, would prove it  
50 all out.

52 **LEG. PICCIRILLO:**

53 But why would you sign -- whoever signed the paper that you can't  
54 talk about these things?



1 **DENISE OLEXA:**  
2 That's privacy for the voter roll database. That's a privacy --

3  
4 **LEG. PICCIRILLO:**  
5 But those are public records.

6  
7 **DENISE OLEXA:**  
8 Well, I mean, I can't speak to that part of it.

9  
10 **LEG. PICCIRILLO:**  
11 I don't know who your attorney is, but I don't know why you'd put  
12 yourself on a gag order to talk about public records.

13  
14 **DENISE OLEXA:**  
15 Okay, we're getting into -- we're getting into distraction issues.  
16 The issue is --

17  
18 **LEG. PICCIRILLO:**  
19 It's not a distraction. We have to take it -- we're not taking  
20 this, you know, we're taking the whole thing.

21  
22 **DENISE OLEXA:**  
23 We're asking for an audit based on the algorithms that are  
24 currently present in the voter roll data base that have been  
25 confirmed and reverse engineered. That on its face renders it  
26 un-certifiable.

27  
28 **LEG. PICCIRILLO:**  
29 Okay, so this is just some advice, I would definitely lead with  
01:30PM 30 that, then, instead of talking about 60,000 duplicate IDs and only  
31 388 of those people --

32  
33 **DENISE OLEXA:**  
34 Okay, but I wasn't talking about that. I'm talking about  
35 algorithms.

36  
37 **LEG. PICCIRILLO:**  
38 As a group. I'm not trying to be combative with you.

39  
40 **DENISE OLEXA:**  
41 Okay.

42  
43 **LEG. PICCIRILLO:**  
44 This is just some constructive criticism back and forth.

45  
46 **DENISE OLEXA:**  
47 Okay, thank you. I appreciate that.

48  
49 **LEG. PICCIRILLO:**  
50 You're welcome. And thank you for your work.

51  
52 **DENISE OLEXA:**  
53 Okay.

54  
55 **LEG. PICCIRILLO:**  
56 We appreciate it.

1  
2  
3 **CHAIRPERSON TROTTA:**

4 Roy Reynolds, you're next.  
5

6 **ROY REYNOLDS:**

7 Okay, we dropped off a package for you guys. Did you get it? It's  
8 got information in it. Okay, great. Okay, my name is Roy  
9 Reynolds. I'm from East Moriches. I wanted to follow up on some  
01:31PM 10 of the points raised by Steve, Barbara and Denise. Last time we  
11 were here you raised quite a few questions about the data we  
12 presented. However, there are many questions that we as private  
13 citizens cannot answer. And they're probably best answered by the  
14 Suffolk County Board of Elections or the state Board of Elections.  
15 Not by us. You have the oversight; you can get it done.  
16

17 Okay, now here's some of the questions that we think should be  
18 asked. Has the Suffolk County Board of Election investigated the  
19 findings of New York State Citizens Audit Deficit Report? If so,  
01:32PM 20 who investigated, what findings were investigated and what were the  
21 results of the investigations? Has Suffolk County BOE investigated  
22 why there exists multiple New York State voter ID numbers for  
23 multiple Suffolk County residents? It should only be one per  
24 resident or registrant. Has the Suffolk County Board of Elections  
25 canvassed the registrants with multiple New York State voter ID  
26 numbers? If so, what were the results? Does the Suffolk County  
27 Board of Elections know why New York State voter data base contains  
28 algorithms? Does the Suffolk County Board of Elections voter data  
29 base contain algorithms? Does the Suffolk County Board of  
01:32PM 30 Elections know who changed the vote counts originally reported by  
31 New York State Board of Elections for the 2020 general election  
32 conforming them to New York State's Secretary of State's reported  
33 count? Does the Suffolk County Board of Elections know why 4,066  
34 registrants in Suffolk County were allowed to vote before their  
35 voter registration dates? Does Suffolk County Board of Election  
36 know why the Suffolk County Board of Election database indicates  
37 that 176 people in Suffolk County voted without a residence  
38 address? Does the Suffolk County Board of Election know why at  
39 least 31 people voted in Suffolk County who are older than the  
01:33PM 40 oldest known living resident in the United States? Does Suffolk  
41 County Board of Elections know who has access to New York voter  
42 data base and is capable of making changes to the data? For  
43 example, agencies, individuals, consultants? Who has access to  
44 the Suffolk County voter base and can make changes? What agencies,  
45 individuals or consultants?  
46

47 So how do we get answers to these questions? Perhaps you could  
48 hold a hearing, just like you had the police up here today  
49 answering questions about the laws being passed, actually the  
01:34PM 50 Safety Committee but something like that, I think, if you brought  
51 those guys in here and asked them some of these questions and got  
52 to the bottom of this, we'd all feel a lot better about this. And  
53 I think they're the gateway to the New York State Board of  
54 Elections. You've been going through the Suffolk County Board of  
55 Elections, they should be concerned that there's a problem with the  
56 state elections, with their voter roll, right, and that's where I

1 think you have to move. If you can put the pressure on those guys,  
2 you may get some answers here and we'll all feel a lot better about  
3 be it. Thank you.

4  
5 **CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

6 I have a question. You made a statement that you had 31 people  
7 over the age a hundred years old vote; is that what you said?

8  
9 **ROY REYNOLDS:**

01:34PM 10 No. Older than the oldest known living resident of the United  
11 States.

12  
13 **CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

14 Okay. Where did you get that information from?

15  
16 **ROY REYNOLDS:**

17 That came from the deficit report.

18  
19 **CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

20 The what report?

21  
22 **ROY REYNOLDS:**

23 The deficit report, the report that we presented to you last time  
24 we were here.

25  
26 **CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

27 I didn't ask that. Where did you get the information from? Who  
28 did you FOIL to get that information? What is the genesis --

29  
30 **ROY REYNOLDS:**

31 Well, I'm sure they got that from the state -- State Board of  
32 Elections. That's where they got their data from.

33  
34 **CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

35 So who did? Did you FOIL it?

36  
37 **ROY REYNOLDS:**

38 No, New York State -- no, New York Citizens Audit did, the analysis  
39 --

41 **CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

42 Get me the return from the FOIL that states that they did it.  
43 Because I'm getting texts of buses dropping off immigrants at the  
44 Smithhaven Mall and there's pictures of people getting out of the  
45 bus. So for you to stand there and say that, prove to me, show me  
46 the FOIL results with 31 people over the age of the oldest person  
47 in New York voted and then come to me and then we will ask for an  
48 investigation. But for to just to come up here and stand here and  
49 say things, there's no bearing in reality. I can just list a  
01:35PM 50 litany of things and make an allegation. If your organization will  
51 physically show us what you saw and prove the four or five  
52 different things I jotted down, please e-mail me those questions,  
53 then, we will have a hearing.

54  
55 **ROY REYNOLDS:**

56 So you want the records for those individuals --

1  
2 **CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

3 Yes --

4  
5 **ROY REYNOLDS:**

6 The records for those individuals --

7  
8 **CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

9 I want to see the voting records that you can say that, look, they  
10 -- and show them to me. I can say anything. I can say an  
11 elephant's going to fall through the ceiling right now, "oh, my  
12 God, look what he said, we have to investigate this."

13  
14 **ROY REYNOLDS:**

15 Right.

16  
17 **CHAIRPERSON TROTТА:**

18 Show it to me.

19  
20 **ROY REYNOLDS:**

22 Okay, we're out of executive session. We will just go over a quick  
23 settlement of a few lawsuits. First, we'll do, we settled for  
24 \$387,500 County of Suffolk versus Ramon Ramos (sic). We settled  
25 for 1.75 million to the Estate of Maureen -- to Maureen Foster for  
26 the estate of Scott Foster. We settled for 210,000 Lorraine Fazio  
27 versus the County of Suffolk. And we settled for 30,000 against  
28 New York Civil Liberties Union against the County of Suffolk. And  
29 one more Madeline Santos versus the County of Suffolk we settled  
30 for \$75,000.

31  
32 Okay, we're going to go back into the agenda. And we have one to  
33 approve or disapprove, **IR 1519, Authorizing execution of a Consent**  
34 **Judgment with the United States Environmental Protection Agency**  
35 **concerning County Large Capacity Cesspools and Motor Vehicle Waste**  
36 **Disposal Wells. (Co. Exec.).** We have a motion to approve by  
37 Legislator Donnelly; second by Legislator Bontempi. All those in  
38 favor? Opposed? Abstentions?
